The College implements the curriculum designed by the Pune University and as per the vision and mission set by Navjeevan Education Society. Before the commencement of the first semester, our College conducts a meeting to chalk out academic planning through the academic calendar. Every year the first IQAC Meeting is conducted at the beginning of the academic year. According to the Academic planner, the distribution of subjects and preparation of time table takes place which mentions the date of commencement and conclusion of the academic session and communicated well in advance as well as curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities

in the academic year. Admissions are done through Maharashtra CET Cell. The institution helps the candidates to fill-up CET forms. The college assists the aspirant student at every step of taking the admission. The College also provides counseling to the prospective students and their parents regarding the career in law, opportunities in law, and various streams under law, etc. After the admission process, in the beginning of the academic year, an induction/welcome session is organized to make new students well acquainted with the institution, objectives of the course, placement facility provided, evaluation & marking pattern and internship, etc. and other activities and programs are organized throughout the academic year. The induction program facilitates the newcomers to no their institution and its ins and outs. All the staff members prepare their teaching and working plans and submit it to the Principal for supervision and periodic review. The regular teaching staff and visiting faculty members adopt different methods and techniques for effective and student-centric teaching-learning process. In view to bridge a gap between Law in theory and Law in Practice, Navjeevan Law College gives equal weightage to the practical aspect of legal education and arranges various activities like court visits, jail visit, police station visit, moot court competitions, elocution competitions, seminar, workshop, guest lectures, other visits, and different cultural activities, etc. The institution has its placement cell which provides the necessary information to the passed out students regarding internships in various courts, and other vacancies available in the government and private sector. The institution caters overall development of a student which believes in continuous evaluation and arranges revision and remedial classes. A mentor's role is to listen when you have questions, concerns, or frustrations, and to give advice or support when they are able. ... But a mentor is not a guarantee of success - and you'll still need to work hard, both in your studies and in maintaining your mentor-student relationship. Mentors play a part in showing how to develop leadership skills, and if you ever have aspirations of being a general counsel, a department head, a managing partner, watching them interact with others and the responses they engender through those interactions are valuable learning tools. The mentoring relationship is unique and for that reason, many people are confused about what the rules are. A mentor should be considered as a trusted advisor - someone you can be real with and gain insight from. But, one should remember it is a professional relationship. Mentors are assigned to a student for the academic year. Even though the students are expected to contact their mentors once a month, we understand that alumni are busy and sometimes may not be able to get back to the student right away. We expect that most of the communication between the mentor and mentee will happen via email, but we hope that each pair finds time for a phone call or video chat at the beginning of the relationship and an in-person meeting, if possible, at some point during the academic year. Mentors and students discuss a variety of topics including strategies for finding and selecting a job, but mentors are not expected to provide job leads. Alumni should not forego the opportunity to volunteer as a mentor because they do not think they are in a position to help a student find a job. The College will help guide the mentoring relationship by providing discussion topics in the areas of academics, getting involved, job search, networking, practice areas/settings, and professionalism/general understanding of the practice of law. Mentors can give you an inside view on what it is like to practice law. This is incredibly helpful, especially since many law school applicants don't know what lawyers actually do on a daily basis.

This academic year SPPU introduced 80-20 pattern. The 20 marks Internal Assessment is conducted at college level for each paper. The university shall conduct the written examination of 80 marks. The internal examination consists of written exam for which a question paper is set by the concerned subject faculty. Prior to the exam the students are provided with a question bank which will help the students to prepare for the Internal Assessment. The paper of Internal Assessment is checked by the concerned subject teacher and evaluation is done and the results are displayed on the notice board. Re examination of the Internal Assessment is conducted for the students who due to unavoidable reasons could not attend the pervious internal exam. Various examination and Evaluation reforms are initiated by the institute and also failed in the Examination.

Effective curriculum deliverance is the main focuses' of the institutions. In order to executive the curriculum effectively a staff meeting is conducted by Principal of the college every month. Every year as a part of practical training students visit is arranged to the Supreme Court or the High Court. In the academic year from 8th February 2020 to 12th February, 2020 final year students visited the Bombay High Court and Panji High Court bench. They observed the court proceeding and have an interaction with Hon. Justice Bharti Dangre Bombay High Court. Students also visited Judges Library and know the procedure of e-filing. Students also visited Salgaonkar Law College Panji and interacted with the law college Principal. Every year the students also visit central jail Nashik, Police Station, Forensic Science Lab, Dipstick Court, etc. as a part of practical training. The students inclusion in the various college activities gives practical experience to the students and to think individually and collectively. The activities include various seminars, workshops, visits, Lecture series, moot court, alumni meet, NSS and SWO activities, etc. We are catering to the need of different types of students like the students coming from rural areas and the students who are having their vernacular problems understanding the law. For them, we organized remedial classes and English speaking and development programs. Through placement cell, we organized guest lecturers for the students including competitive examination, communication skills, etc. the students are helped after passing of their law examination for choosing their senior to enter into advocacy profession they are given information regarding the various option available after passing of their law courses. The Scholarship and freeship facility is available to the backward and economically backward students as per the government norms. They can avail these concessions at the fullest and the non-teaching office staff always cooperates with them. The legal aid clinic approved by Maharashtra state legal services authority is functioning for providing free legal aid and assistance to the poor and needy persons. The legal awareness camps are also arranged in the rural arrears. In the library Text Books, Reference Books, Journals are available physically for the last 50 years. In our library we have two Databases 1) Manupatra 2) Click Judgement which is use full for students to search recent case laws and bare Act. Eleven personal computers are available for the students with internet facility. Teaching Staff member is given their own PCS so that they can utilize it for their research purpose. The salaries of the staff members are paid strictly through Bank Account and the provident fund and other social security facilities are given to them. The feedback forms are filled up from the passing out students and the suggestions are always welcomed. The alumni meet is also organized every year. The induction program is arranged every year for the

newly admitted students to provide them the knowledge relating to the college, manners and etiquettes, opportunities and law studying, etc.
