THEME OF THE SEMINAR

"Vulnerable & Disadvantaged Groups vis-a-vis Criminal Justice -A Human Rights Perspective"

We are living in the era of technology which is making dent in the life of Human being. Society is not remained immune to implication of change and Faster communication with the help of technology defining new terminology, relation and situation of society. There is particular section in the society which always considered Vulnerable and disabled. This segment always remained helpless and forced to remain underprivileged. Law and Judiciary always played their crucial role of guardian to protect this section of society. The meaning of vulnerable is highly evasive. However, in common understanding, people who are easily susceptible to physical or emotional injury, or subject to unnecessary criticism, or in a less advantageous position in any society may be defined as vulnerable people. Accordingly, vulnerable groups are those groups of people who may find it difficult to lead a comfortable life, and lack developmental opportunities due to their disadvantageous positions. Further, due to adverse socio-economical, cultural, and other practices present in each society, they find difficult many a times to exercise their human rights fully. People who are discriminated based on sex, race, by birth in a particular community, religious or disability or any other criteria that is specific to each society may generally described as disadvantaged people. Based on the socio, economic, cultural perspectives, the classification of these groups vary from country to country. In general, women, children, socially, economically, culturally deprived sections, disabled, minorities etc. form part of disadvantaged groups. Poverty is the main contributing factor towards degradation of the status of these people that are classified as disadvantaged groups.

The Constitution of India, civil, political, economic, social, and cultural rights for their realization by all sections of the Society without any kind of discrimination. However, due to poverty, customary and cultural practices prevalent in the country, equal opportunity has been denied to various categories of people that have prevented them from enjoying their rights equally at par with other developed sections of the society. There are various disadvantaged groups of people such as women, children, Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Linguistic Minorities, Religious Minorities, Sexual Minorities, Aging Person, Indigenous People, differently abled persons etc. In order to augment their rights, the Constitution of India has provided a number of concessions to protect them from exploitation by other groups. In order to bridge the gaps in the social system, the Legislature has adopted a number of progressive legislation extending concessions to augment the rights of these people. The Judiciary too in a number of cases has liberally interpreted the provisions of the Constitution and various legislation to uplift the rights of the vulnerable groups. The vivid expansion of Public Interest Litigation or Social Action Litigation by the Supreme Court of India is a welcoming feature, compared to its counterparts across the world. The Judiciary has been protecting the right of the vulnerable group with judicial precedent. But biggest hurdle in country like India, observed is the lack of awareness of rights and time consuming process betray this vulnerable group from justice. Justifiable efforts needed to be taken so that these section become aware of their rights and justice should be delivered

In this state level seminar our objective is to acquaint the legal fraternity with Rights of Vulnerable and disabled group and help students to understand current need of society.
