THEME OF THE SEMINAR:

Intellectual property (IP) refers to creations of the intellect for which a monopoly is assigned to designated owners by law. **Intellectual property rights (IPRs)** are the protections granted to the creators of IP, and include trademarks, copyright, patents, industrial design rights, and in some jurisdictions trade secrets. Artistic works including music and literature, as well as discoveries, inventions, words, phrases, symbols, and designs can all be protected as intellectual property. While intellectual property law has evolved over centuries, it was not until the 19th century that the term intellectual property began to be used, and not until the late 20th century that it became commonplace in the majority of the world. Violation of intellectual property rights, called "**infringement**" with respect to patents, copyright, and trademarks, and "**misappropriation**" with respect to trade secrets, may be a breach of civil law or criminal law, depending on the type of intellectual property involved, jurisdiction, and the nature of the action. According to **Article 27 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights**, "everyone has the right to the protection of the moral and material interests resulting from any scientific, literary or artistic production of which he is the author". The arguments that justify intellectual property fall into three major categories, **Personality theorists** believe intellectual property is an extension of an individual, **Utilitarians** believe that intellectual property stimulates social progress and pushes people to further innovation. and **Lockeans** argue that intellectual property is justified based on deservedness and hard work. TRIPS, the Agreement on Trade-Related Aspects of Intellectual Property Rights is an International treaty by the World Trade Organization (WTO) which sets down minimum standards for most forms of intellectual property (IP) regulation within all member countries of the World Trade

It was negotiated at the end of the Uruguay Round of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT) treaty in 1994.

After India signed the General Agreement on Trade and Tariff (GATT) and the Trade Related Aspects of Intellectual Property Rights Agreement, 1994 (TRIPS) and became a member of the World Trade Organization (WTO). As India is a signatory to the TRIPS Agreement and is a member of WTO, the Patents Act is amended in 2005 to make it conform to these international agreements. Before the recent amendment Section 5 of the Indian Patents Act, 1970 expressly prohibited product patents and only permitted process patents. After the implementation of TRIPS, the Patents (Amendment) Act, 2005 repealed it and therefore gave way to product patents as well. The National Pharmaceutical Policy, 2006 has been announced, it is focusing on research and drug development with clinical trials. The policy lays emphasis on developing human resources in pharmaceutical sciences by opening more institutions on the pattern of the National Institute of Pharmaceutical Education and Research (NIPER). The policy aims at providing a better access to anti-cancer and anti-HIV/AIDS drugs to the patients.
