#### 1.1 – Curriculum Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 – Institution has the mechanism for well planned curriculum delivery and documentation. Explain in 500 words

Navjeevan Law College, Nashik offers LL.B. (Three Year Course) and B.A.LL.B. (Five year Course) and two diplomas i.e. Diploma in Taxation Laws and Diploma in Labour Laws and Labour Welfare. The College implements the curriculum designed by the Savitribai Phule Pune University effectively as per the module prescribed by the Bar Council of India and as per the vision and mission set by Navjeevan Education Society. Before the commencement of first semester, our College conducts a meeting to chalk out academic planning through academic calendar. According to the Academic planner, the distribution of subjects and preparation of time table takes place which mentions the date of commencement and conclusion of academic session and communicated well in advance. Academic calendar provides the minute planning regarding curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities in academic year. The institution provides the facility of counseling to the prospective students and their parents regarding

the career in law, opportunities in law, and various streams under law etc. After admission process, in the beginning of the academic year, an ice-breaking session is organized to make new students well acquainted with the institution, objectives of the curriculum, placement, evaluation pattern and internship etc. and other activities and programmes are organized throughout the academic year. All the staff members prepare their teaching and working plans and submit it to the Principal for the supervision and periodic review. The regular teaching staff and visiting faculty members adopt different methods and techniques for effective teaching learning process. In view to bridge a gap between Law in theory and Law in Practice, Navjeevan Law College gives equal weightage to the practical aspect of legal education which comprises participative, experiential and problem solving learning method and arranges various activities like court visits, jail visit, police station visit, moot court competitions, elocution competitions, articles, seminar, workshop, guest lectures, other visits and different cultural activities etc . The institution has its placement cell which provides internship in various courts, district legal service authority and legal aid clinics. The institution caters overall development of a student which believes in continuous evaluation and arranges revision and remedial classes. Feedback from students and stakeholders is taken every year and acted upon for the betterment of the institution and society after proper analysis. The institution organizes programmes for personality development and communication skills essential for law profession. The institution has the separate examination cell with Chief Examination Officer (C.E.O.) as its head which carries continuous internal assessment of all students. The Institution has rich library resources with electronic data base and reading facilities.

The Institution conducts a term-end exam in the college before university exam and provides counseling for the preparation of final exam.

Feedback Obtained

1. Administration: The major power is confronted by the Chief Executive and delegated to the Principal. The college has separate statutory bodies in regulating the overall functioning of the institution. Financial powers are exclusively given to the head of the institution and monitored by the Navjeevan Education Society Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune. Through the application of participatory mode of management, the college has been able to entrust teachers and administrative staff with more responsibilities in decision making. Rather than a top-down approach where the decisions made at the top and would trickle down to the students and teachers, the College involves students and staff in the decision making process. 2. Participatory Management: The participatory nature of the administration is ensured by the formulation of Various Committees.
